Transportation: We rely on parent involvement to drive to pick up students on time to and from practices and games. A carpool system will be organised to ensure efficiency and fairness for all parties involved. Please let us know if you are able to provide transportation services. We would also love to see you come out to support your child at their games! A reimbursement for driving will be given to parents who volunteer if requested. Please keep track of KM driven from Carver to the destination and back. A school bus is also an option if more than one team is going to the same location or if there are 12 or more individuals going to away games, unless public transportation is more convenient. A late bus/van for practices will be provided if there are 5 or more students.

* You grant permission to your son/daughter to ride in the school van/bus with a licensed driver.

* You grant permission to your son/daughter to ride in another parent's vehicle to and from games with a licensed adult driver.

Parent Code of Conduct

1. It is imperative that parents are involved in the athletic program at Carver Christian. Parents need to be positive and supportive to enrich their children's involvement.
2. Parents need to voice their concerns in an appropriate manner to their children and the coach. Consult the chain of command to follow grievance procedures.
3. In many situations we rely on parents for transportation and consent.
4. Maintain self-control at all times at contests. Recognize and applaud good play by all athletes in the contest. Encourage positive behaviour not negative actions. Respect officials and their decisions.

The Chain of Command

The chain of command is an important communication tool for parents. Parents must communicate through their children and children to their parents because of the day to day nature of athletics. Coaches and staff sponsors must give notice of all games and tournaments at the beginning of the season. The majority of communication will be done through the Carver website and by the coach/managers through email or by some means of internet. The staff sponsor is ultimately responsible for communication with the home and collecting all the fees when a community coach is involved. The coach and staff sponsor must dialogue with the athletic director on a regular basis. Any problems, changes to the schedule, or academic ineligibility should be communicated to the athletic director. The athletic director is responsible for communication to administration.

Communicating Concerns and Grievances

STEP 1: The first step in the chain of command is for parents to communicate with the coach/staff sponsor. In the case of a grievance parents should present their concerns to the coach at a pre-arranged meeting. It is not appropriate to communicate concerns on the phone or email.

STEP 2: The second step in the chain of command is for parents to meet with the athletic director. The athletic director will follow up with the coach and the staff sponsor and, if necessary, inform the administration.

STEP 3: If the parent is not satisfied with the actions of the athletic director the final step is to set-up a meeting with the schools administration.
