

2) In your teams, please prepare a **write-up** that outlines the following areas, and which you will present to the class for feedback:

1. Purpose/rationale (objective) of your plans
 - a. Why did you choose to lead these activities you have chosen?
2. Target audience: elementary, intermediate, high-school, seniors
 - a. Please include preparations for each of these age groups
 - b. Be sensitive to the needs of each age group, as well as keep in mind the possible language barriers
3. Materials/facilities needed
 - a. If materials are needed, what are they? Does Carver already have them, or do we need to buy it? How much would it be to purchase them? What facilities (room? furniture?) would be needed for us to lead this activity?
4. Team members needed
 - a. Who or how many of our team would be needed to lead this activity? For example, if you were leading games for elementary school children, would everyone in the class need to help lead the games? Or just a few? Would you need translators?
5. Description of the activities you planned
 - a. Please briefly describe what the activity/idea is that you have
6. Teaching English component
 - a. Describe how your activity includes “teaching English” component. For example, what simple English words can be incorporate into the teaching of the activity, so that others can pick up English words as they engage in the activity?

3) Individual preparations:

- a. Pray! Pray on your own, and pray for your teammates, and pray as a team. Pray for God to prepare our hearts, to prepare the hearts of the people of China, and for God to work in us and transform our hearts as we go out into the world to serve.
- b. Prepare your personal **testimony**. Think of a way in which you can share about how God entered into your life and who He is to you, in simple language. Be prepared for any opportunity in China where you may be asked to share, and with the help of a translator.
- c. Create a **photobook** that you will take with you to China. This photo book should be a small collection of photos about you, your life, your life in Canada, etc. This is a good way to begin conversation as we minister in different places, to be able to show others a little bit about yourself and share about your life. For examples, pictures of your family, friends, school, pets, Canada (snow!), etc. are great for sharing about your culture and background.
